Detective Gore and I contacted Cyrus Sullivan at his dorm room on PSU campus on Monday 04-18-05 at 1135 hrs. We were accompanied by a PSU Public Safety Officer. Detective Gore introduced himself and me to Cyrus. Cyrus was initially reluctant to admit who he was but then did acknowledge he was Cyrus Sullivan.

Detective Gore explained that we were there to speak about Cyrus sending out the bogus sex offender notifications on his former T&B brothers and also asked about the STD Clinic notification that Cyrus had sent out. Cyrus denied any involvement with either incident. Cyrus denied using "[redacted]" when emailing or instant messaging and denied signing "T891." Cyrus denied sending any of the notifications to the frat or sororities via email.

When Detective Gore started to question Cyrus about his activities [redacted]

Detective Gore explained that we just wanted Cyrus to tell us the truth about what had happened and that he was prepared to cite and release Cyrus if he was truthful. Detective Gore explained that the alternative was to arrest Cyrus, secure his room and apply for a search warrant so we could look for and seize his computer as we believed it would contain evidence of the crimes.

Cyrus said, "I think I should talk to my attorney." Detective Gore told Cyrus he was under arrest and had him turn around. Detective Gore handcuffed Cyrus behind the back and checked the cuffs for proper tightness then [redacted] looked them. Cyrus was wearing a T-shirt and boxer shorts and asked, "Can I put some pants on?" I told him that he could but that we would have to accompany him in to get them. Cyrus turned and led us through the entry way to the right and into a bedroom.

There was a computer monitor and keyboard on a desk to the left as we walked into the room. A Dell computer tower was on the floor under the desk. Detective Gore was on the left of Cyrus (and closer to the computer desk) and I was on his right. Detective Gore said, "There is paper by the computer that says [redacted] on it. There was a pair of pants on the floor near the bed and I asked Cyrus if those were the ones he wanted and he said they were. The pants contained a wallet, keys and an inhaler all of which I left in the pockets. Detective Gore and I assisted getting the pants on Cyrus and he put on some sandals.

The computer was in plain view and Detective Gore had information that Cyrus had used a computer to email notifications and had used a computer to instant message at least one frat member and referenced the sex offender notifications. We both believed the computer would contain evidence of the crimes of Forgery and Criminal Impersonation. Detective Gore seized the computer tower and requested Cyrus for it. He will apply for a search warrant so the hard drive can be imaged and searched.

We escorted Cyrus to our car and transported him to BCCF. He was booked and released.
